COMMUNICATOR

- I have formal training and practical experience in various areas of patient communication including breaking bad news and patient consent based on my clinical training in Family Medicine and as staff physician in the ICU
- I make it a rule to review my dictations as frequently as possible, sometimes more than once a day to ensure timely delivery of final reports. This includes finalizing reports during vacation time from remote destinations via the internet
- During my angiography rotations I frequently was the first physician from the angiography team to see the patient and would take that opportunity to obtain informed consent and address any patient concerns
- During night call I always communicated any urgent findings to the referring physician directly by telephone in addition to providing a written report

COLLABORATOR

- Consultations with referring clinicians and clinical services when request is made for imaging: discussion regarding most appropriate imaging test in work-up and evaluation of patient, during daytime rotations and particularly on-call
- Involved in multidisciplinary rounds during residency, including Neuro rounds at the XYZ Children's Hospital during my pediatric rotation
- As a senior resident on hospital rotations I tried to consult with my colleagues doing the same rotation every morning to partition the workload in order to ensure that all the work is done in a timely fashion and ensure that the work is equitably and fairly distributed

- As a senior resident I tried to take charge of the service on a particular rotation to the extent possible and be involved in everyday organizational tasks essential to the practice of radiology. For example, while doing the MSK rotation at the XYZ Hospital during fall 200X, because of an unanticipated personal tragedy the staff providing most of the coverage had to leave for 2 weeks. During that time, I protocolled studies, assisted consulting physicians, and triaged cases that needed

- urgent reads, providing a preliminary report and promptly reviewing those studies with attending staff covering the service at the sister hospitals

For example, during nightcall at the XYZ Children's Hospital in February 200X after identifying a case of testicular torsion, I immediately called the referring physician and the surgical service, before typing the written report, to inform them of the diagnosis and requirement for prompt intervention
