AI in radiology - will it solve our problems, or create new ones?

Dr. Adrian Brady

Dr. Brady is a Clinical Professor of Radiology at University College Cork, Ireland, and a prominent leader in the field of radiology. He served as President of the European Society of Radiology (ESR) from 2022 to 2023 and currently holds the position of Past-President of the ESR for the 2024-2025 term.

Additionally, he is a member of the Executive Committee of the International Society of Radiology.

With over 185 peer-reviewed publications and more than 180 invited lectures, Dr. Brady has made significant contributions to radiological research and education. He serves on the scientific editorial boards of leading journals, including European Radiology, Insights into Imaging, Canadian Association of Radiologists Journal, and Radiologia Brasileira.



His primary areas of interest include professional issues in radiology, particularly in errors and discrepancies, reporting style and content, value-based radiology, the ethics of AI, and clinical audit.
