**NAME OF ROTATION: Paediatrics** 

#### **FOCUS OF THIS ROTATION**

• During this rotation residents will be responsible for the management of pediatric patients admitted to the general paediatric in-patient units at the Hospital for Sick Children. The majority of clinical care will be provided on the inpatient units; however, residents will experience admitting patients from the Emergency Department and ambulatory clinics. Residents will also have the opportunity to see patients in the day hospital for follow-up care after discharge from hospital. The rotation will consist primarily of working on an inpatient ward team and residents will have the opportunity to participate in both overnight and daytime (weekend) call opportunities with appropriate support and supervision. Residents may be asked to prepare a topic for presentation at teaching rounds.
